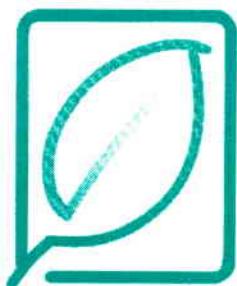

INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

1. The manuscript should be prepared in APA style. Refer to the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, Fifth Edition (2001). (Ordering information can be obtained from APA, 750 First Street, NE, Washington, DC 20002-4242.)
2. See current issues of *The Person-Centered Journal* and the APA Publication Manual for examples.
3. Double-space everything, including references, quotations, tables, and figures. Leave generous margins (at least an inch all around) on each page.
4. Avoid footnotes whenever possible (see APA Publication Manual for alternatives).
5. Use tables sparingly and type them on separate pages. Include only essential data and combine tables whenever possible. Refer to the APA Publication Manual for style of tabular presentations.
6. Lengthy quotations (generally 300 cumulative words or more from one source) require written permission from the copyright holder for reproduction. Adaptation of tables and figures also requires reproduction approval from the copyright source. It is the author's responsibility to secure such permission, and a copy of the publisher's written permission must be provided to the Editor immediately upon acceptance of the article for publication. Authors submitting transcripts of actual cases will be required to sign a waiver acknowledging that client informed consent has been secured.
7. Place authors' names, positions, titles, places of employment, and mailing addresses only on the cover page. Requests for an anonymous review should be specified.
8. *The Person-Centered Journal* requests that authors choose words carefully, avoiding sexist language, and showing sensitivity to cultural and other individual differences. The terms client, student, or participant are preferred, rather than subject.
9. Never submit previous published material or material that is under consideration by another periodical.
10. Submit three hard copies of the manuscript, and an abstract of up to 150 words to Jo Cohen Hamilton, Ph.D., Managing Editor, *The Person-Centered Journal*, Department of Counseling and Human Services, Kutztown University, Kutztown, PA 19530. Please keep a copy of manuscript to guard against loss. Email submissions with attached files are accepted at JonMRose@aol.com
11. It is expected that most manuscripts submitted for publication in *The Person-Centered Journal* will undergo revision before final acceptance.
12. Because of the production process of *The Person-Centered Journal*, authors whose manuscripts have been accepted for publication are asked to provide both hard and disk copy of the final manuscript prior to the editors sending it on to press. Windows 95 or 98 software is preferred. Please submit labeled diskette with author names and software used.

Note: Authors bear full responsibility for the accuracy of references, quotations, tables, and figures.

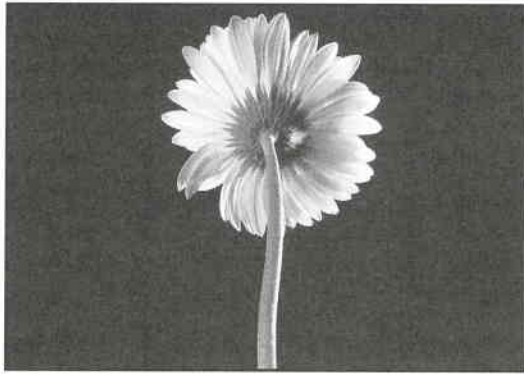
