# INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

- 1. Manuscripts should be prepared in APA style. Refer to the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, Fifth Edition, 2001. (Ordering information can be obtained from APA, 750 First Street, NE, Washington, DC 20002-4242. Http://APA.Org).
- 2. See current issues of *The Person-Centered Journal* and the *Publication manual* for examples.
- 3. Double-space everything, including references, quotations, tables and figures. Set margins to 0.75" left and 2.5" right.
- 4. Avoid footnotes as much as possible (see *Publication manual* for alternatives).
- 5. Use tables sparingly and type them on separate pages. Include only essential data and combine tables whenever possible. Refer to the APA *Publication manual* for style of tabular presentations. Figures (graphs, illustrations, line drawings) must be submitted in MS Word format (not embedded objects) and must be black-and-white only (no color). Figure captions should be on an attached page, as required by APA style.
- 6. Lengthy quotations (generally 300 cumulative words or more from one source) require written permission from the copyright holder for reproduction. Adaptation of tables and figures also requires reproduction approval from the copyright source. It is the author's responsibility to secure such permission, and a copy of the publisher's written permission must be provided to the Editor immediately upon acceptance of the article for publication. Authors submitting transcripts of actual cases will be required to sign a waiver acknowledging that client informed consent has been secured.
- 7. Place author's names, positions, titles, places of employment and mailing addresses only on the cover page if requesting an anonymous review.
- 8. The Person-Centered Journal requests that authors choose words carefully, avoiding sexist language, and showing sensitivity to cultural and other individual differences. The terms client, student or participant are preferred, rather than subject. Never submit previously published material of material that is under consideration by another periodical.
- 9. E-mail submissions, sent as an attachment in MS Word are preferred. Send to <a href="PersonCenteredJournal@Yahoo.Com">PersonCenteredJournal@Yahoo.Com</a>. Otherwise, submit two copies of the manuscript including an abstract of up to 150 words and a 3.5" disk copy to: Barry Grant, Ph.D., Argosy University, 1 North Park, Ste 308, 8950 N. Central Expwy, Dallas, TX 75231. Authors should keep a copy of their manuscript to guard against loss.
- 10. It is expected that most manuscripts submitted for publication will undergo revision before final acceptance.
- 11. Because of the production process of The Person-Centered Journal authors must submit an electronic copy of the manuscript (final version) in MS Word PC format, before it can be copy edited and printed. Use e-mail or 3.5" diskettes. The corresponding author and manuscript title must be clearly labeled on the diskette.
