

What we've done so far:

- Digitized and created cataloguing system for 233 transferred reel to reel tapes, a small # (29) were unplayable / disintegrated. Many need closer listening to determine and improve content. We have a team of more senior therapists reviewing content. We want to thank our CCA intern, John Fuente for fully managing the transition of tapes to digital format, including repair to old reel to reel machines and advising on storage systems.
- Listened to and coded 50 recordings to illustrate type of content (for example, family therapy, practicum lecture, etc.). Created an indexing and coding system.

The recordings include:

- Rogers lectures
- Therapy sessions: individual, couples, family; one series from 1966 with Nat as therapist
- Practicum lectures, workshops and other discussions led by Marshall Rosenberg, Barbara Brodley, Greg Washington, Gene Gendlin, Alan Rohlffs, Jim Iberg, Gary Prouty, Hannah Frisch, Bateman, Roudenko, ...
- Titles such as Black Therapy and the Black Experience (1981)
- Psychotherapy Research Series (1966)

Updates:

- We are adding a new person to help with the project: Isabella Villa Bahamon
- Allocation of funds: We have spent \$5000 of the \$10,000 requested at 2019 ADPCA meeting. This includes about \$910 in supplies (repairing two reel to reel players, purchase of 2 external hard drives and one antivirus program for loaned computer dedicated to digitizing, purchase of a scanner for paper archive) Remaining funds (about \$4,090) have been spent in wages for tape and paper transfer to digital, review and cataloguing. We expect to request the next \$5000 this month.

What we still need to do:

- Finish listening to and coding remaining recordings
- Clean up/edit recordings with poor sound quality
- Continue to scan documents
- Set up a system to share documents and recordings (as appropriate for content) online.
